Neighbors are continuing to express concern about unleashed and wandering dogs, and dogs that bark excessively.

The following are excerpts from Parish Ordinances related to these “nuisances”:

4-126.00 Public Nuisance

- Excessive or untimely barking, howling or yelping
- Attacking or molesting passerby or other animals
- Chasing vehicles; scratching on or digging into or urinating or defecating upon lawns, shrubs, buildings or any property, either public or private, other than property of the owner or keeper of an animal
- In the case of nuisance by defecation, the owner or keeper must remove all feces and dispose of them in a sanitary manner

4-129.00 Leash Law

- It shall be the duty of the owner or keeper of an animal to have such animal confined within his or her yard or enclosure, or secured by a humane method therein.
- No dog shall be permitted to run or be upon any street, alleyway, highway, common or public square unless under the immediate control of a competent person and restrained by a substantial chain or leash.

4-134.00 Penalties

Individuals found guilty of these misdemeanors shall be fined and/or imprisoned according to an established schedule, ranging from \$50 and/or 10 days in jail to \$500 and/or 30 days in jail.
